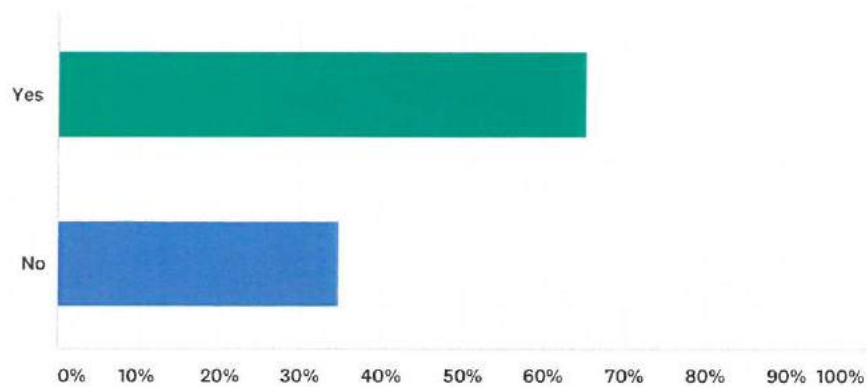


Q1 Do you believe your child should be given homework?

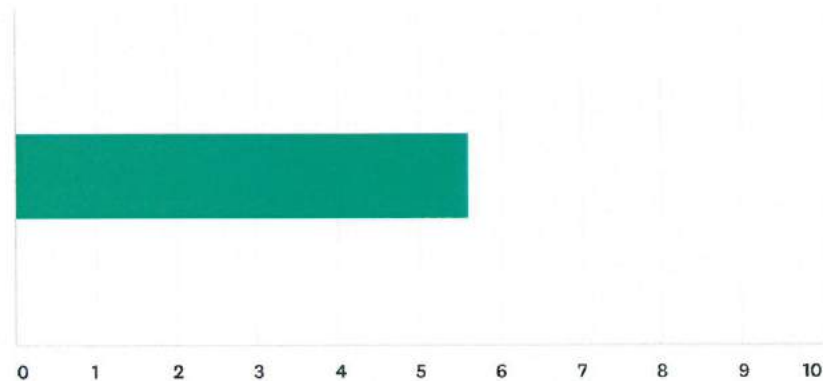
