#### Buildings and Works Shelter structure Lyon Road

The shelter structure on Lyon Road outside our Early Childhood precinct has now been completed just in time for the Winter weather. The Department of Communities have recently spent time at the school to audit the Camp Australia team, in a similar fashion to our school review. The representative from Department of Communities spent two full days on site, talking to staff, families and the students to assess the process and planning for the out of school provider. Although the audit was extremely intensive for the team, they believed that their planning and ability to showcase Camp Australia in the best possible light was very successful. It complimented the Year Five Science Curriculum, where our students have been learning about our solar system, in addition to giving our students and their parents a first taste of independence in readiness for the Year 6 school camp in 2020. A fun night with the additional novelty of sleeping at the school overnight was enjoyed by all, although not a great deal of sleep was had by everyone that participated! It is anticipated that as part of our developing upper primary leadership approach, the school sleepover will become an annual event on our school calendar.

# Early Childhood Showcase Tour

Melanie Osborne recently hosted the first Early Childhood Showcase Tour for school leaders in the CCEN and beyond in Week 3, Tuesday, 6<sup>th</sup> August. This was our first step of sharing our journey in our Early Childhood phase of learning to other schools, who are interested in what can be achieved in a public education early childhood setting. The session had a focus on the development of our Early Childhood Philosophy, our play based learning approach and the recent review and changes made to our approaches in the Kindy and Pre-Primary areas in phonological awareness. The classrooms were opened to the tour group, who were then able to see learning in action, in addition to providing the forum for rich professional conversations about our Early Childhood journey to this point. The tour was so well received by the leaders and our teachers, that we are now going to explore how we can provide another session for teachers in the network who are looking to improve their practice. Our teachers were thrilled to talk about and share their experiences in this change management process. I would like to pass on my sincerest thanks to the Early Childhood team, led by Melanie Osborne for allowing the wider community to share in our journey, with the aim of supporting other schools to improve outcomes for all students in public education.

## **NAIDOC Week**

At Aubin Grove Primary School, we are an inclusive and multicultural community that is culturally responsive and values the diversity in our students and families. Recently, we recognised NAIDOC week with celebrations, education and recognition of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander, first peoples of this land. Our aim in celebrating this very significant week in the national calendar is to build upon our existing knowledge about Aboriginal history, culture and practices, through providing our students the opportunities to engage in oral storytelling, singing, dancing, and craftmaking experiences. Many students in their classes went on the Noongar language treasure hunt around the school, in addition to families taking the time to enjoy the visual displays of boomerangs contributed by all of our students around our central library and staffroom building for the week. Thank you to all of the teachers and staff who provided such an educational and dynamic week of learning and celebration for our community.

To conclude the week, the school's rock band, drumbeat group and selected senior choir members performed on Thursday August 1<sup>st</sup> at the Crown Theatre for the Western Australian Government Schools Music Series with a number of other primary and secondary schools.
