CAPITAL WORKS

Concerns have been with the effectiveness of the evaporative air conditioners in some of these rooms, insect issues and replacement of carpets and air cons in Room 38.
- Ongoing and daily work in this space is continuing hopefully reaching a resolution before the end of this term. Students in Room 38 have been relocated to the library, until the works in their room can be completed.

- Year 3 and 5 students have been undertaking NAPLAN assessments over the past two weeks.

NAPLAN has been moved from the traditional Term 2 dates to Term 1, to return data to teaching staff so they can continue to target the learning for individual students after this assessment.

The move also hopefully supports Year 7 students who have transitioned into high school earlier to close the gap between primary and secondary school.

SWIMMING LESSONS BEGIN FOR 2023



- Year 1, 4 and 6 students have all participated in their annual 2 week block of swimming lessons for 2023.
- We have returned to our chosen location of Kwinana Recreation Centre as the centre has proven to be more conducive to in term school swimming. The students are really enjoying their lessons and working with their swimming instructors.
